2. Chinese New Year Celebration

The school will be celebrating Chinese New Year on <u>28 January 2025</u>, <u>Tuesday</u>. Students will report to school at 7.30am and be dismissed from school at **10.30am**. As indicated in the Calendar of Events 2025, kindly note that 29 & 30 January are public holidays. Students will return to school on Friday, 31 January.

i. Attire

To create a festive mood for the occasion, students are encouraged to wear their ethnic costumes on that day with school shoes. If your child/ward prefers not to wear her ethnic costume, she is required to come in school uniform.

ii. Things to bring

There will be **no** lessons on that day. Students are required to bring the following items for their classroom activities during the CNY celebration:

Level	Things to bring for classroom activities
P1, P2	 Writing materials, colour pencils/markers, (optional: recycled magazines and glue)
P3, P4	 Writing materials, colour pencils/markers, glue
P5, P6	Writing materials, colour pencils/markers, stapler and glue

There will be snack time as per normal school day. Please also ensure that your child/ward brings food for her snack break in class.

iii. Dismissal

Do make the necessary transport arrangements if your child does not take the school bus home. Parents/Guardian will only be allowed to drive in to pick up the students after **10.40am**. Please observe traffic rules around the school and do not come to school earlier than the stipulated pick-up time for school dismissal. Enforcement actions may be taken against vehicles found parking indiscriminately or waiting before 10.40am.

Dismissal at Gate 1 will be staggered according to the following timings:

3. CNY Used Red Packets Recycling Initiative

The tradition of giving and receiving red packets (hongbao) during Lunar New Year is cherished by many of us. However, we also recognize the environmental impact of discarding these red packets after use. In partnership with Geneco, we will be placing a special collection bin just outside the General Office for the purpose of recycling the used and excess red packets. Starting from Friday, 31 January, until Friday, 28 February, students are encouraged to deposit their used or excess red packets into this bin. To facilitate the recycling process, we kindly request that students empty the contents of the red packets before placing them in the bin. 4. Parent Support Services- Signposts for Building Better Behaviour

In collaboration with our parenting support partner Lakeside Families for Life @ Community, we present for your consideration **Signposts for Building Better Behaviour**, an evidence-based parent education programme tailored for caregivers of children (aged 5 - 9 years) to prevent or manage challenging behaviours. This programme is specifically designed to provide essential skills to comprehend, prevent, and manage your child's/ward's challenging behaviour through a personalised programme.

Signposts is fully funded by MSF and offered free of charge, with a limited intake. It is delivered face-to-face in small group sessions, and commitment to attend all five sessions is needed.

6. P3 Weighted Assessment

In line with MOE's direction to reduce school-based assessment and nurture lifelong learners, the school will not have any mid-year examination for P3. This will also provide our students with more time to adjust to the transition and adapt to the new demands of the level.

Although there is no mid-year examination, students' learning will continue to be monitored and appropriate support will be provided. Current practices to gather information about students' learning through class discussions, homework, topical tests remain to support students' development and achievement in learning.

Bite-sized forms of weighted assessments will be conducted in Term 2 and Term 3. The table below shows an overview of the assessment weightings.

There will only be one weighted assessment per day and a maximum of 2 weighted assessments per week.

Please note that there will be no make-up for weighted assessments and end-of-year examination. Students who are absent on the day of assessment are to submit valid supporting documents (e.g. medical certificate) to their form teachers upon returning to school the next day. Student's performance for that subject would be captured as 'VR' (Valid Reason). The overall marks for that subject would then be pro-rated accordingly.

For cases of absence without a valid reason (e.g. local/ oversea external competition not representing school/nation), results will be reflected as 'AB' (Absent). This would mean that the student would not get any marks for the assessment and/or paper missed.

We seek your continued support for your child/ward in her learning and encourage her to find joy in her educational journey.
